

Moving into STEP 4 of the Government Roadmap (England) and what that means for businesses





Lifting of Restrictions

- 19th July Government Announcement lifting of restrictions in England from 19th July (with some limited exemptions) but it is clear we remain in a pandemic
- Scotland & Wales lifting restrictions at a different pace
- Emergency Covid laws remain in England to enable public health teams to re-impose restrictions to deal with outbreaks





Do I have to do anything different? (1 of 2)

- Social distancing guidance no longer applies (England)
- Continue to control the risks and review and update your risk assessment – it should reflect the public health regulations and guidelines for the nation you are in
- Continue to use key control measures remain to reduce the potential spread of the virus:
 - Providing adequate ventilation
 - Regular cleaning; and
 - Good hand hygiene





Do I have to do anything different? (2 of 2)

- You can continue to take measures to limit the number of people your workers are in contact with (see GOV.uk guidance)
- You should put monitoring and supervision in place to make sure the controls you have are working as expected.
- Continue to consult your workforce on health and safety matters, talking to workers and their representatives helps to reduce risk

Social Distancing Exceptions (England)



- Ports of Entry It applies
- Healthcare and adult social care settings It applies if identified by risk assessment

Identified high risk settings due to vulnerabilities within their communities or risk of an outbreak include:

- Prisons, Approved Premises (accommodation for prisoners released on licence) and Youth Custody
- Immigration Removal Centres
- Homeless Shelters
- Domestic Cruises

1M+ lifted but can be reinstated as part of local outbreak management



HSE visits

At this stage of the pandemic – Visiting staff will continue to address COVID-19 control measures.

HSE to support public health bodies during outbreaks, respecting local measures which may be re-imposed, including social distancing measures, under continuing emergency Covid legislation.
